6.3.1 Curriculum Development

- 1. Though the institution is affiliated to Bharathidasan University besides following the academic syllabus prescribed by the University, college take pride in stating that curricula for Moral Classes, Yoga, Certificate Course, Short-term Course etc are being formed by the faculty members.

- 5. Motivating the Advanced Learners to take up higher studies, consistently at different occasions.

6.3.3 Examination and Evaluation
